



With our expanded team we have re-organized staff roles to better serve ROCs in Montana.

Danielle is now our Cooperative Housing Director, overseeing the ROC team, as well as other cooperative housing projects at NWMT.

Adam is now our ROC Acquisition Specialist, overseeing the conversion of new parks and reaching out to potential sellers.

Autumn will be supporting all existing and future ROCs east of the Rocky Mountains, currently including ROCs in Billings, Great Falls, Havre, Livingston, and Red Lodge.

Welcome, Hideaway Community!

On January 27th, Hideaway Community in Columbia Falls became the 15th Resident Owned Community in Montana. The residents of Hideaway began organizing at the end of September 2021 and held their *We Own It* celebration on March 12th, 2022. Hideaway's conversion to resident ownership will eventually bring 30 homes into the nationwide ROC family. Moving a few new homes into Hideaway will be one of the top priorities after the completion of a major septic overhaul. In order to apply for funding for the septic project, Hideaway residents have formed their own water and sewer district and will be electing five community members to serve on the water and sewer district board of directors. Creating a water and sewer district will allow Hideaway Community to apply directly for funding and speed up the process of getting their project funded and finished.

The NeighborWorks Montana ROC team was impressed by the hard work and diligence of Hideaway's pre-purchase board of directors, all of whom were re-elected to their positions at their first member meeting. The directors are: Devynn Fetter, President; Joe Rohrman, Vice President; Kelley Weigant, Secretary; Shonda Kennedy, Treasurer; and Dustin Wynn, Board Operations.

NeighborWorks Montana recently co-sponsored the Montana release of the film, *A Decent Home*. The documentary, by filmmaker Sara Terry, highlights several communities – a successful ROC, a community that went through an agonizing closure, political battles, and more. In the film, the filmmaker vividly shows the importance of resident voices and how using your voice is necessary to preserving manufactured home parks.

"They speak about community, about neighbors helping neighbors, and about the happiness that comes from living a life that they can afford. They volunteer at homeless shelters; they lead Boy Scout troops; they collect cans to help fund worthy causes; they set aside what they can, even \$5 a month, to give to their favorite charities, including the World Wildlife Fund and the local food bank. We need to hear these people, we need to see these people, we need to value them and everything they represent about the best of who we are as Americans." I am John Egan and I am now serving as the Mountain West Director with the ROC USA Association, and look forward to working with you all!

I claim New Mexico as my home state, but have lived in Colorado for over 20 years and at Animas View Mobile Home Park for over 10 years. Our park, located on the banks of the Animas River in Durango, became a cooperative after the then-owners announced (on Christmas Eve no less!) the park was for sale. If it were not for the new Colorado law requiring mobile home park owners to notify the residents of the sale of mobile home parks, we would have been hapless park residents who didn't know their park sold until the

next rent hike! Thanks to ROC USA and our Colorado CTAP, Thistle ROC, plus a lot of sweat, toil and trust of our residents, and major assistance from both the City of Durango and the State of Colorado and other important stakeholders, in 90 days we managed to make a competitive offer that was accepted by the seller. Since then Thistle and ROC have done an outstanding job of guiding our co-op as we continue to improve our beautiful community!

I served as the president of our board of directors during that precarious time and it was through the efforts of many people that we pulled our 'rabbit' out of the hat! My contribution to this project was many years of experience serving on numerous boards and having been both a city councilor and county commissioner. I understood how the system worked. I was also the chief cheerleader for the purchase of our park. I like to think organization, leadership, and diplomacy are my talents.

I pledge to offer my service and skills to all the Montana ROCs and to this vast region we call the Mountain West. I invite you to call on me anytime. Thank you!

Helping Montanans find a path forward

NeighborWorks Montana and the Montana Housing Counseling Network have recently expanded services to offer Housing Stability Counseling. This service expansion links clients across the state to HUD-certified and trained Housing Counselors who can:

- Help navigate applications for emergency housing assistance
- Help communicate with landlords and mortgage services
- Connect you with a lawyer for legal guidance
- Help provide guidance and next steps to improve housing stability
- Help create budgets and financial plans to support more financial peace of mind

The goal of the expanded services is to help Montana households become more stable and learn about managing their finances to avoid crisis and meet future financial goals. Clients work with the counselor one-on-one through multiple sessions and can learn how to create and manage a budget, improve their credit, pay off debt and increase savings.

It's a Great Time for Some Maintenance!

Spring has made its entrance, and with that, spring cleaning comes to mind! Proper home maintenance is vital to keep heating and cooling costs down, and pricey repairs at bay. Keeping your home and lot clean and tidy also improves the appearance of the community you and your neighbors call home. It also reduces stress and makes your home more welcoming for you after a long day's work. Many ROCs coordinate a community-wide "spring clean up", please reach out to your community board members or property manager to inquire if there is a plan in place. If not, make a suggestion to get one scheduled! Get involved and help your neighbors make your community shine!

How can you do your part? Here are some tips:

- Clean your vents, ductwork, A/C or swamp cooler to ensure dust and debris aren't present and that all hoses and filters are replaced if needed
- T Inspect and clean your home's siding, look for needed repairs this can extend the life of your siding and save you money in the long run
- Check the skirting, underbelly, and vapor barrier of your home to make repairs
- T Unplug heat tape and inspect water lines under your home for leaks (Undetected leaks can be a strain on your community water budget)
- Look at windows for breaks and ensure window and door seals are intact

Did you know that as a member of the ROC USA network, you have access to discounted home repair and improvement materials? Be sure to login into your myrocusa.org account or sign-up for an account to access to these offers!



Share Your Concerns with Governor Gianforte!

Nearly half of Montanans do not have access to internet services, limiting connection to crucial internet-based services like telehealth appointments and distance learning options for students. The state of Montana has an opportunity for a once in a lifetime grant to connect underserved and rural areas with high-speed internet services.

Montana Governor Greg Gianforte and the advisory commission are in the process of reviewing proposals and make the final call on this project.

As a ROC resident the lack of internet access limits availability to hold video meetings with residents and your certified technical assistance providers (NWMT/ROC USA), as well as online learning and leadership training opportunities.
