Building Together What Would Be Impossible To Build Alone

The Montana Cooperative Development Center (MCDC) is a nonprofit 501(c)3 organization whose mission is to promote and develop cooperatives to meet the economic and community needs of rural Montana. For 20 years, MCDC has delivered quality technical assistance to cooperatives and communities across Montana.

As Montana moves into the recovery phases left in the wake of COVID-19, MCDC is working on building resiliency within communities across the State. The objectives for MCDC this year are to:

- Create an atmosphere for resilient communities through the development of "Home Economics" Cooperatives; grocery stores, distribution and supply chains, childcare, and housing.
- Recover Montana communities through value-added, production, and sustainable agricultural practices
 utilizing the Cooperative Business model, specifically addressing the shortage of meat processing facilities
 and the need to preserve working farm and ranching landscapes.
- Build vitality for Montana Main Streets by providing an outlet for retiring business owners to convert their companies to worker cooperatives and through education on how investing cooperatives could revitalize communities.
- Innovate and empower communities to meet their economic needs, through the collaboration of businesses to build shared-serve cooperatives for efficiency and sustainability.
- Expand the economic impact of the Montana Cooperative Development Center thru collaborations and initiatives across all of Montana and within the seven tribal reservations.
- Strengthen the cooperative ecosystem in Montana and build sustainability for the Montana Cooperative Development Center by expanding services and educational opportunities for cooperatives and the professionals who serve them.

Montana Cooperative Community is vibrant and diverse. Cooperatives serve all sectors, all industries, and can be found in every corner of the State. With the support and dedication of the established electrical, telecommunications, credit unions, and agricultural service cooperatives, new cooperatives are emerging and are creatively bringing solutions to communities.

Montanans who are having difficulty paying their rent or mortgage due to COVID-related loss of income are urged to apply for the Emergency Housing Assistance Program through the state of Montana.


This program provides rent, security deposit, mortgage payment assistance, and/or hazard insurance for those who have lost their job or substantial income due to COVID-19, up to \$2,000 per month.

- The program pays the difference between 25% of the household's net monthly income and their eligible housing costs.
- Annual income limits range up to \$125,000 based on family size.
- Applicants are eligible to apply even if they have now returned to work or regained income.

NeighborWorks Montana is hosting a virtual statewide homebuyer education course next month! We will be joined by partner organizations who will be leading the sections throughout the course, giving valuable statewide perspective. The four sessions will be held September 14-17 from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM. Registration is required. If attendees complete all four sessions and have a one-on-one with a housing counselor, they will be issued a certificate of completion. However, it is not a requirement to complete all four days. Anyone is welcome to join for the topics that most interest them to gather pertinent information but will not be issued a certificate.
