They do this through partnerships with local and national food manufacturers, agriculturists, and other food manufacturers, securing large amounts of food through generous donations, grants, or wholesale. With the help of a team of volunteers, they break down the large-scale food into manageable family size portions so their partner agencies and other programs are able to easily store and distribute these to those individuals around the state that are struggling to make ends meet.
